- Making research contributions discoverable
- Identifying and recognizing contributors
- Ensuring the widest possible access
- Measuring impact

# ORCID provides persistent digital identifiers that distinguish researchers from each other

  - Nihon University
  - NIHR





### What is Fundref?

- A registry of funder names and IDs, abbreviations, alternate names, and countries
  - Funder ID required for inclusion in Fundref search
- Open resource maintained by Crossref and Elsevier
- Integrated into eJP, EM, S1 m/s submission systems
- IDs may be included in article metadata submitted to Crossref

- Community-led response to OSTP memo
- Not-for-profit membership organization
- Online services and best practices to enable public access
- Uses existing infrastructure and workflows
  - Including Fundref to identify funder in metadata

SUBJECT: Increasing Access to the Results of Federally Funded Scientific Research

#### 1. Policy Principles

The Administration is committed to ensuring that, to the greatest extent and with the fewest constraints possible and consistent with law and the objectives set out below, the direct results of federally funded scientific research are made available to and useful for the public, industry, and the scientific community. Such results include peer-reviewed publications and digital data.

Scientific research supported by the Federal Government catalyzes innovative breakthroughs that drive our economy. The results of that research become the grist for new insights and are assets for progress in areas such as health, energy, the environment, agriculture, and national security.

Access to digital data sets resulting from federally funded research allows companies to focus resources and efforts on understanding and exploiting discoveries. For example, open weather data underpins the forecasting industry, and making genome sequences publicly available has spawned many biotechnology innovations. In addition, wider availability of peer-reviewed publications and scientific data in digital formats will create innovative economic markets for services related to curation, preservation, analysis, and visualization. Policies that mobilize these publications and data for re-use through preservation and broader public access also maximize the impact and accountability of the Federal research investment. These policies will accelerate scientific breakthroughs and innovation, promote entrepreneurship, and enhance economic growth and job creation.

### CHORUS helps compliance

- Simplifies access compliance for researchers
  - Built into submission process no extra work
- Verifies that articles are publicly available
- Dashboard reports
  - Funders, institution, and public can freely monitor compliance
  - Members-only reports (for self-publishers and societies working with publishing partner)

- Drives traffic to best available version of article
  - On publisher's platform
- Articles are discoverable via CHORUS Search, search engines, agency portals
- Open APIs allow development of new tools that support discovery and access



- Clearly identifies articles that are (or will be) publicly available
- Associates articles with relevant funders



### CHORUS helps access

- Minimizes the cost of providing public access
  - No cost to funders, institutions, researchers, or the public
- Provides researchers and the public with easy access to publicly-funded articles
  - 'Gold' articles are available immediately on publication
  - 'Green' articles are available after an embargo period
- Perpetual public access enabled




### CHORUS facts and figures

- 38 member organizations
  - Includes major publishers, scholarly associations, and publishing vendors
- Five funder agreements
  - Two announced: Department of Energy,
     Smithsonian Institutions
  - More announcements soon
- >420k DOIs with Fundref IDs (>180k+ US)
- >176k reported in CHORUS dashboard
- >33k verified publicly accessible in CHORUS

### **ORCID** uses Fundref registry



### What is ORCID?

- Free, non-proprietary registry of persistent unique public identifiers for researchers
- Non-profit community initiative supported by member fees
- Open data, software, APIs, and documentation
- Integrated with numerous researcher workflows including grant submission
- Uses Fundref to connect grant awards to ORCID iDs



### ORCID helps compliance

- Reduces reporting burden for researchers and their institutions
- Helps keep institutional repositories updated



### ORCID helps discoverability

- Distinguishes researchers from others with the same or similar names and connects researchers across their name variations
- Unambiguously connects researchers with their research contributions and affiliations
- Facilitates search across platforms



### ORCID helps recognition

- Enables researchers to connect their ORCID iD with their research contributions
- Enables funders, institutions, publishers, societies, and others to connect iDs with many types of research contribution



### ORCID helps impact

- Allows funders to monitor their funded research irrespective of grantee moves, name changes, etc
- Facilitates funder gap analysis, interprogram comparisons, and more



### ORCID facts and figures

- >1.7m registrants
- ~350 organizational members
  - 60% research institutions
  - 55% Europe
  - 4 national consortia
- >200 live integrations



### Fundref challenges

- Universal adoption
- User-friendliness issues
- Coverage growing but not yet comprehensive
- Fundref funders with no IDs



### CHORUS dhallenges

- Grow membership/become self-sustaining
- Partner with more agencies
- Engage with wider community (beyond publishers and funders)
- Agree international strategy
- Evolve services in tandem with the needs of the scholarly community
- Work with service providers to ease the path to full implementation



### ORCID challenges

- Implementation throughout workflows:
   collection and connection
- Define communications: what ORCID is and is not
- Continued cross-sector and international engagement
